TABE is a Test of Adult Basic Education in reading, mathematics, and language at all levels. The test is designed to assess skills in the contexts that are most important to adults: life skills, work, and education. TABE provides both norm-referenced and competency-based information to help you evaluate your student's abilities and plan for individual education and training needs.

The TABE is the main test used by adult literacy programs funded by the State Education Department to place students in adult basic education (ABE) classes and to measure educational gain. Highlights include a test and scoring tables overview, effective test administration, using TABE scores for placement, and a discussion of the relationship among TABE test scores, class placement, and outcome reporting.

Study circles are organized around a central topic. In this case, we are focusing on ESL instructional practices. The groups typically meet for three to five sessions. We will be meeting for three sessions and phone conferencing for two additional sessions. The group is led by a facilitator who will suggest and disseminate materials prior to each session. The participants are asked to review the materials so they may engage in interactive discussion during the session regarding the use of the materials to inform instruction in their classroom practice. The main goal of the study circle is for participants to translate research into practice in meaningful individual ways with the support of their program managers.
