- Three star quizzes are appropriate for students working at sixth grade level and higher.


Write SMART is designed to be multi-media.



- The SMART program was developed on the Moodle platform utilizing the browser Firefox, thus the suggested browser. SMART also works with Chrome, Explorer and safari. This can also be used on smartphones.
- As a Write SMART teacher, it is important to experience the SMART program as a student in order to better assist and guide your students.
- To use the SMART website, cookies must be enabled on your computer.
- PLEASE do not delete or "un-enroll" any groups or students. All student information must remain on the site, even if they have done just one or two lessons.
- For any auditing purposes, it is important that all information is kept for seven years.

- Write SMART was created to be used sequentially. Unlike other courses in which a student can just do certain lessons, Write SMART is designed for the student to complete each unit in order. Each lesson builds upon the lesson before, and each unit builds on the previous one.
- Write SMART is for the student who has TABE tested at a reading grade level equivalent 4 and above.



Teacher Log-in

During lunch, we made your accounts nonediting teachers. So you now have two roles:

- Student
- Non-Editing Teacher

You use the same username and password for both roles.

Creating a Class

Log-In and navigate to your DASHBOARD

- My Courses
 - Write SMART

Scroll down to ADMINISTRATION (left-hand side)







Creating a Class- Cont'd

Under Administration:

- Click "Users"
- Click "Groups"
- Click "Create Group"

Never, ever delete a group. You'll be deleting all of the students' work!

EVEN IF YOU HAVE ONLY ONE STUDENT WHO NEVER DID ANY WORK ENROLLED IN THIS GROUP, DO NOT DELETE!

Naming Your Group

There is a specific formula for naming your group NYSED wants teachers to use for auditing purposes.

Enrollment Key

Create your own Enrollment Key that you will give to students who want to register in your specific class

Unmask as you type!

Enrollment key security is the same as password security. That is, it must contain:

- 1 capital letter
- 1 lowercase letter
- 1 number
- 1 non-alphanumeric character

You must enroll yourself in your class- VERY IMPORTANT FOR GRADING!

Add or Remove Users

Ideally, a student would create an account for himself/herself and use the enrollment key you handed him or her to be assigned to your group.

However, you may manually add or remove users, if needed.
