Newsela - BE (<https://newsela.com/>)

- Create a login and password (free)/ or log in.
 - You will need to verify your email by clicking on the email sent to you.
1. Once you have created your login and password, go to articles, select a topic and then an article. (Click the light bulb) What article did you choose?
 2. The right side of the screen displays different reading levels. Select the different reading levels. How does it change the article?
 3. What other features do the articles display on the right hand side of the screen?
 4. Click the Text Sets Tab at the top of the screen. Click on one of the text sets topics (click the light bulb). When you find an article you like, wave your cursor over the light bulb. What pops up?

GCFlearnfree – BE (<http://www.gcflearnfree.org/>)

1. Go to the math tab, and scroll down to the games link. Select a game and play it.
2. Click on the Microsoft office tab (from main page). List 5 applications that would be beneficial to your students.
3. Click on the apps tab (from main page). Click the GCF Quiz App. Click on google play. Search through the GCF Quiz application. How might you be able to integrate this into your instruction?
4. Click on the career tab (from main page). Click on online money tips. Search through the money tabs. How could you integrate this into your instruction?

1. Go to the worksheets tab and click on vocabulary. What worksheets might be helpful for your instruction?

4. Click on the more tab. There are a lot of additional tools busy teacher offers. Which would you use?

1. Click on Activities and quizzes on the left hand side of the site. Click on activities. Select a topic that would be helpful for your students. What were some activities you discovered?
2. Click on Files at the top of the page. What files are offered?
3. Click on Videos at the top of the page. What types of videos are offered?
4. Click on the Lessons tab at the top of the page. Search through the offered topics and lessons. Which ones might you use?

1. Click on the views tab. Search through the offered videos. Did you find anything you would be able to use in your instruction?
2. Click on the mixer tab. On the featured video, click activities 1-25. Which activities might be helpful for your students?
3. Click on the videos tab and then new videos for mixers. What videos did you check out?
4. On the left hand side of the screen, there is a section that says levels. Click through the different levels. What happens to the articles/videos offered?

1. On the left hand side of the page, under stuff for teachers, click on Idea Cookbook. Search through the offered topics. Which topics did you look through?
